a Brief History

The orchestra was founded in October 1947 under the name 'York Orchestral Society'. It comprised only fourteen members. Mr. Hartley conducted with Mr. Popely as leader and Mr. Welch as secretary.

The aim of the society was to stimulate the interest of young students both at concerts and through the medium of the schools, with a programme of music to embrace classical, opera, ballet, light opera and the whole range of light classical music.

In October 1948 the name of the orchestra was changed to City of York Light Concert Orchestra (YLO). The first performance was on 6th October 1948. By September 1949 numbers had swelled to 42 members. YLO continued to accompany local groups for many years including Clifton Hospital Amateur Operatic and Dramatic Society, New Earswick Dramatic and Operatic Society, York Operatic Society and Tadcaster Amateur Operatic Society.

The orchestra performed the first of its 'ENCORE' concerts as part of the City of York Mystery Plays and Festival of the Arts at St George's Hall in June/July 1969. Regular 'Encore' Concerts at the Tempest Anderson Hall, sponsored by the York Corporation entertainments Committee, continued until 1980.

YLO moved to its current home at Acomb Methodist Church in 1994 and embraced the 21st Century with the launch of its website in 2004.

YLO is a rare organisation being one of only a few 'Light Orchestras' still existing today and joined the Light Music Society in October 2005 to aid in the promotion and preservation of this unique type of orchestra.

The last ten years have seen a few changes of conductor and an influx of new members but the principles of music making for all ages and charitable fundraising for the community are still at the heart of the orchestra. Although St Leonard's does get some public funding the majority of the running costs have to be raised from donations and fundraising by the local community - businesses, groups and individuals. Legacies are by far our greatest source of income.
